

CVNA Minutes

Present at meeting Twenty people attended the Collins View Neighborhood Association's cookie and munchie potluck meeting on Dec. 3, 2014 at Riverdale High School. An insurance claim for damages requires a timely police report. The reports help the city decide where to patrol more. Using Nextdoor to report an incident is NOT recommended

January 9th is the deadline for making comments on the Portland Comprehensive Plan website. Use the interactive map on the website <https://www/portlandoregon.gov/bps> to make comments. Anyone can send a letter. The closing date for written letter comments is March 13.

We want to make sure to address the five things in our CVNA letter to the City. We can specifically pick and comment on each one of these on the interactive map. <https://www.portlandoregon.gov/bps/65337...> Mark the map with these five items. The more people who comment, the more likely we will get these improvements. Money has already been allocated as part of the Comprehensive Plan; marking the map will help determine how it is spent.

The Collins View Issues are:

1. Realignment and reconfiguration of the SW Terwilliger Blvd. and SW Boones Ferry Rd. intersection.
2. A crosswalk and flashing light at SW Primrose across Terwilliger and a sidewalk connecting the east side of SW Terwilliger Blvd. from the crossing to 2 blocks north to the retail district.
3. A sidewalk and lighting along Terwilliger Blvd. from Boones Ferry Road to the Law School.
4. The missing 3 blocks of sidewalk. A newly constructed sidewalk extends from SW Spring garden Rd. to only as far as the SW 10th Ave. on Taylors Ferry Rd. Three crucial blocks of sidewalk to SW 7th Ave are missing. (SW 7th Ave is only one block from the intersection of SW Terwilliger Blvd and SW Taylors Ferry Rd.)
5. Implementation of a neighborhood greenway between Lewis & Clark College and the retail area at Terwilliger and Taylor's Ferry via SW Palatine Hill and SW Primrose Streets.

The Willamette Greenway Plan is part of Portland's Comprehensive Plan and should establish the policy framework for City actions affecting the river, including infrastructure investments, city services, and regulations affecting development. The Southwest Corridor Plan Steering committee is scheduled to meet Monday, Dec. 8, from 9 to 11 AM in the Tigard Public Services Building. At this meeting, the Southwest Corridor Plan steering committee will recommend an 18-month work plan, review latest technical findings, and help shape the next phase of outreach. Public testimony will be at the start of the meeting.

Mark Duntley said the value of Lewis and Clark's contribution to the Neighborhood's annual picnic is \$4500 (if we were to rent the space) and \$1500 for the catered beverage service. He has inquired about the Neighborhood Emergency Team (NET) meeting on College grounds in an emergency.

The ongoing project of educating students to be good neighbors is an opportunity for the neighborhood and College to collaborate. Contact Mark directly about student related issues.

Paula Robinson, Principal of Riverdale High School, said things were going great at Riverdale. 150 families were present at the open house.
